



Clinical Classification of Glaucoma

- Cong glaucoma occurring during intrauterine life.
- Infantile glaucoma from birth to 3 years.
- Juvenile glaucoma from 3 years to 17 years.

Primary glaucoma is:

- Open angle or
- Chronic simple.

Closed angle is:

- A C glaucoma
- A A C glaucoma
- Creeping A C glaucoma

- Pseudo exfoliating glaucoma
- Malignant glaucoma
- Contusion or angle recession glaucoma
- Steroid induced glaucoma
- Aphakic glaucoma
- Absolute glaucoma.
