After a short period of a decrease in the number of infections with Covid-19 patients all over the world, we recovered and began in Iraq to discuss and evaluate the results and the future of our previous work in the field of orthopedics in general and Arthroscopic surgery in particular. Where it became clear to us that there are many successes that have been achieved in this field despite its recent. We were able to count many orthopedic surgeons who perform most of the surgeries for the knee view Arthroscopically after they were referred to neighboring countries almost ten years ago, despite the limited capabilities available to us here in Iraq.

Not long ago, we started using platelet-rich plasma (PRP) in the treatment of certain cases of Osteoarthritis of the knee joints and they noticed an improvement in the joints treated in this way, so I started using PRP in the treatment of partial rupture in the anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and the results were good through clinical follow-up for periods of more than three years. This is a remarkable progress in this field, especially as we avoided the patient with the anterior cruciate ligament reconstruction in such cases, and the player's return to the courts at intervals that are considered record compared to those with persons with ACL reconstruction surgery.
