# Wintering sighting of Lesser spotted Eagle Aquila pomarina from Gujarat, India



### **Abstract**



Brown rounded head, yellow cere and cutting edge of the bill is short, hooked black bill, white spotted brown wing coverts, contras with white spotted blackish brown secondary coverts, primary coverts black extend to black banded tail.



On 24th of January, 2006, I was on my way back from birding trip to wild Ass Sanctuary, Bajana range district Surendranagar. At 1500 hrs, I visited Malika wetland. I sited Eagle like bird perched on dump, shoot some images, it was differing in plumage and size, than Indian spotted eagle A. hastata and greater spotted eagle A. clanga has a rofous-brown head, hooked greyer bill with black tip, yellow(gap), cutting of bill extend upto eye, white spot on brown wing coverts, contras with white spotted secondary coverts black primary coverts, extend to black banded short tail. Observed at Vekaria village. Over all black, rounded head, hooked black bill with yellow cere and cutting edge of the bill, white spot on wing coverts and shoulder, contras with dark black secondary coverts, long primary coverts extend to tail tip, white on vent and lower belly. These diagnostic differences are obvious and disconnect it as a different and separate species and recognized as a Lesser spotted Eagle by consulting literature on Raptor.

#### Introduction

The bird Lesser spotted Eagle Aquila pormarina is medium sized eagle, smaller than Indian spotted eagle A. hastate and Greater spotted eagle C. clanga, but larger than Indian tawny and steppe eagle. The race A. pomarina and A. hastata, both race are different and separate species and elevated to full species level and recommended to be that as a separate species, according to A. clanga; Perry S. J., Clerk, W. S. and Prakash V. [1],'s research paper on "Taxonomic status of Indian spotted eagle A. hastate IBIS 144 [4], page 665 to 675". Naoroji [2] has only mentioned Indian spotted eagle A. hastate ("Birds of prey of Indian subcontinent") in his book, but does not include lesser spotted eagle Aquila pormarina, del hoyo [3] and Lees. J.F., C. David [4] has does not showed India in distribution map of lesser spotted eagle Aquila pormarina. some possibility in north-west India during winter migration- Rasmussen [5]. The bird Lesser spotted eagle A. pomarina accures in Czechoslovakia, Hungry, Yugoslavia, Romania, Bulgaria, Greece, Turkey- Gensbol [6]. bird start automan migration movement during August and extend to through middle of September. During winter Bird is accures east-Africa sevanna from Sudan to Transvaal. some reported from further west (chad and camerron) and some may remain in Balkans, Asia minor or Egypt -Gensbol. B, del hoyo, Borrow n. and Demey R [7].

Over all black plumage, flated head, hooked white bill, tip black, cere and cutting edge of the bill yellow, hooked black bill, white spot on wing coverts, contras with white spotted secondary coverts, primary coverts extend to central of square ended tail.

Dark brown head, yellow cere and long cutting edge of the bill, stripless breast, white spotted brown wing coverts, yellow legs.




Figure 1: Indian spotted eagle (A. hastate).

### **Observation**

Observation area is spreaded over more than  $4000 \, \text{sq.} \, \text{km.}$  with Nal Sarovar Bird Sanctuary, Vadla wetland, Black Buck National

Park (Bhavnagar), Thol bird Sanctuary (Dist. - Mehesana), Wild Ass Sanctuary (Dist. - Surendranagar). All the sites are known for Feathered waterfowl, raptor and thousands and thousands of passerine birds. Last ten years, many vagrant birds were recorded in this site.

White on vent and base of undertail coverts, white strips on breast.




